

## Advanced Surf Kayak Leader Syllabus

### Aim

Attainment of this award indicates that the candidate has attained a high level of performance, personal skill and group management in advanced situations. It is a leadership award and the appropriate test for paddlers who wish to lead groups of other paddlers in remote or advanced surf.

Following assessment British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leaders must have in place civil liability insurance (included in comprehensive Home Nation membership), knowledge of Child Protection guidelines and good practice including checks where necessary and maintain evidence of currency.

### Advanced Surf Definition

**Area:** Reefs, points, offshore breaks and sandy beaches, which may have significant hazards (e.g. rocks, strong rips, etc.) and may be remote and/or have difficult access.

**Character:** Waves may be powerful, steep, pitching, fast, hollow and heavy.

**Height:** Up to, and above double overhead when seated in a kayak in the trough of the wave (or head high, and above for a stand up surfer).

### Training and Assessment Courses

To achieve British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader candidates are required to attend British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader Training, and Advanced Surf Safety and Rescue Training. These courses involve at least 3 days of formal training in personal skills, leadership, and safety and rescue. Training is valid for 3 years, during this time, and upon completion of the assessment prerequisites, candidates can then put themselves forward for assessment. Assessments are normally run over 2 days, including 2 evening exercises.

It is also strongly recommended that further training be undertaken based on the candidate's action plan in different areas and a variety of environmental conditions.

### Accredited Prior Learning (APL)

APL may be appropriate for candidates with relevant and extensive paddling and leadership experience who wish to request exemption from the requirement to hold the relevant British Canoeing Leadership Award or British Canoeing Level 3 Coach before being able to access British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader Training.

### **Training Prerequisites**

- British Canoeing Surf Kayak Leader or British Canoeing Level 3 Surf Coach (see note above regarding APL).

### **Assessment Prerequisites**

- Home Nation British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leadership Registration (LR)
- Valid (within 3 years) British Canoeing recognised 2 day first aid award
- Previous experience: The candidate must provide documentary evidence of approximately 40 advanced days in a range of surf locations. These must show experience of different break and wave types. Such experience must have been gained normally over a minimum of 3 years' surfing paddling, the surfing experience showing a bias towards exposed or more challenging surf environments. Candidates should also have appropriate experience in management, safety and rescue, prior to assessment
- British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader Training (within last 3 years)
- British Canoeing Advanced Surf Safety and Rescue Training
- Candidates must be 18 or over at the time of assessment

### **Craft**

The candidate may present themselves in any craft in which they are able to complete the syllabus.

### **Equipment**

Candidates should have personal and group equipment appropriate for the remit of the award and relevant to the assessment environment.

### **Trainer and Assessor**

British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader Provider.

### **Assessment Venue**

A British Canoeing Advanced Surf Kayak Leader must be capable of riding in advanced surf. They should be fully conversant with reefs, points and heavy waves. At this level it is important for candidates to be able to accurately assess the surf in terms of its suitability to paddle on and

therefore no upper limit of size should be set. The assessment will access at least 1 surf venue that is not a simple beach break; this may be a point, reef or a break requiring a short coastal journey.

If during assessment conditions are not suitable the process may be postponed.

## Technical Syllabus

The candidate is required to perform all skills on both sides.
