



This programme is for clubs to apply for funding to support club volunteers to gain Foundation Safety and Rescue Training or 3 star award as prerequisites for BCU UKCC coaching awards. An offer of funding may be up to 50% (subject to maximum of £87.50/day). Clubs can seek funding from other sources and contribute their own funds to the remainder of the course cost. In order to apply, clubs must submit this application form to the SCA in advance of the course and will be required to complete a Club Profile questionnaire (via SCA Self Service) prior to funding being released. All individuals will also be required to complete a profile via SCA Self Service to assist with the monitoring of the funding.

Application Process

- 1. Clubs apply on the application form, endorsed by club committee, evidencing the need for the funding and the benefits the money will bring. Applications should include details of the individuals who will attend the course (SCA membership numbers and names), and a breakdown of the financials club contribution, candidate contribution, other contribution.
- 2. Clubs provide an estimate of the cost, having obtained a quote from at least one suitable provider.
- 3. Applications are compiled by the SCA at the deadline and checked against criteria and the outcome notified to the club shortly afterwards.
- 4. Clubs can submit multiple applications at same time.
- 5. There are no deadlines for applications and they will be considered on a first come first served basis.

Eliqibility Criteria

- All candidates must be current SCA Full or Junior members at the time of the course.
- 2. The Club must be affiliated to the SCA at the time of applying and remain affiliated until at least the last day of the course.
- 3. Candidates must be attending a course taking place in Scotland and delivered by an SCA registered Tutor/Assessor.

Conditions:

- 1. Candidates must complete a Paddling and Coach Profile via SCA Self Service prior to the time of the claim.
- 2. Funding does not cover the cost of SCA membership or Travel & Subsistence.
- 3. The allocation of funding is determined by the SCA, and their decision is final.
- 4. Candidates are required to complete an equity profile; via SCA Self Service.
- 4. Claims must be made within 60 days of course completion
- 5. Payment will only be released following completion of the award elements and submission of valid receipts (photocopies are acceptable), and the completed course schedule is received from the course provider.
- 6. Until an offer of funding is made in writing, no guarantees of funding can be made.
