

# SCA Subsidised Training for Affiliated Clubs 2014

The SCA Subsidised Training for Affiliated Clubs Programme aims to provide financial support and subsidised courses SCA members within Affiliated Clubs. The aim of this programme is to support volunteers in clubs achieve leadership and coaching qualifications in order to strengthen the club. The course is delivered in two main strands.

<b>How the courses will be organised</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCA will organise courses centrally using existing staff and contractors.</li> <li>• SCA will advertise courses, process bookings and appoint providers.</li> </ul>	<p>This strand is delivered in a combination of ways:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. SCA will organise ~6 courses centrally. SCA will advertise courses, process bookings and appoint providers.</li> <li>2. Clubs can apply to SCA for 50% of the cost of running a course for their members up to a maximum of £87.5 per day of training and the club engages a SCA registered provider on their choice. <i>BCU candidate fees are not required (saving £5/person).</i></li> <li>3. Approved Paddlesport Providers can apply to SCA to run 'Open' courses, SCA still take bookings etc.</li> </ol>
<b>Candidate Criteria</b>	<p>All candidates must be an SCA Full or Junior member and in an Affiliated Club. Clubs will be asked to confirm support.</p> <p>Tay Descent volunteers are also eligible for this training.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Candidates must be an SCA Full or Junior and in an Affiliated Club and be registered for Level 1 (for FSRT) or for Level 2 (for 3 star)</li> <li>• For option 2, Clubs must have at least 4 candidates to apply for a course (either from their own club or other clubs in their region).</li> </ul>
<b>Booking Arrangements and Costs</b>	<p>Candidates book online via Self Service and pay £25/day (£50/course). Places allocated on first come first served basis.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Candidates book online via Self Service and pay £25/day.</li> <li>2. Clubs apply as and when they wish. Applications will be considered on a first come first served basis. Once approved, clubs arrange their own course, process their own bookings within the club, arrange and pay the provider and submit a claim to SCA.</li> <li>3. Candidates book online via Self Service and pay £25/day. SCA will pay providers directly.</li> </ol>
<b>Other Information</b>		<p>This strand is focused on supporting clubs to gain more qualified coaches hence the requirement for all candidates to be registered for a coaching award.</p>
