

Grandtully Campsite Rules

By entering on the premises, all users are deemed to agree to be bound by these rules and the disciplinary code of the Scottish Canoe Association (the SCA). All users are required to follow the directions of the Campsite Manager. The management may refuse admission at any time.

Hazards and Risks

- Use of the campsite and car park is at the user's risk. There are hazards which have not been marked. Users are warned to take particular care to keep away from steep slopes and the platform edge.
- Users are responsible for loss or damage to their own property at all times, and the SCA will not accept any liability for users' property whatsoever.

Use and payment

- Camping and facilities are normally available throughout the year. Parking, showers and toilets are available in the campsite area for day use by non-campers who must pay the day-use fee.
- All users must register and charges must be paid **ON ARRIVAL**. Details are displayed on the building.
- If a user has not paid the full amount, the Manager may ask the person to leave immediately.
- If you do not have the correct money, you must overpay, and claim your change back from the campsite manager.

Vehicles

- The Speed limit 5 mph and vehicles are not permitted on the grass
- Only campervans and towing vehicles for caravans are permitted in the designated caravan area

Safety

- Users are responsible for the safe condition and use of their own appliances - cookers, stoves, heaters etc.
- Bulk gas or other fuel storage is prohibited.
- Portable electricity generators are prohibited.
- Open fires are prohibited – no campfires or bonfires.
- Barbeques are allowed only on non-flammable surfaces – not on the grass.
- Gas or liquid fuel and appliances are prohibited from the building and compound.
- Do not tamper with fire extinguishers or alarms – they are provided for emergency use only.
- Camping units must be spaced 6m apart. A "camping unit" is a caravan, campervan or a single group's tents.
- All users should note the position of the Assembly Point, nearest Fire Point and read the Fire Action notice.
- Group Leaders are responsible for the whereabouts of their group, and for the group's head-count in case an Assembly is called.

Pets

- Pets are permitted provided they do not cause nuisance. The Campsite Manager's decision on any pet is final.
- Pets must be kept on a lead at all times and must not be left unattended.
- Pet waste must be lifted and removed immediately

Waste and hygiene

- Pitches must be kept tidy and all refuse must be placed promptly in the container provided outside the gate.
- Caravan Chemical toilet - Contact the Campsite Manager for access to the disposal point.

Security

- Key codes must not be passed on to anyone. Every party is supplied with the codes by the Campsite Manager – we need to know who is on site at any time.
- The gate must be kept closed and locked at all times. Do not leave the gate lock with the code showing.
- Keep the door to the building closed at all times.

Discipline

- Party Leaders are responsible for the orderly behaviour of their party members.
- The SCA reserves the right at any time to remove anyone whose behaviour is deemed to be unacceptable by the Campsite Manager. The Campsite Manager will report any incident to the Campsite Executive, who may refer the matter to the SCA Board of Directors for further action.
