Scrutineering

There will be checking of boats for air bags and checking of buoyancy aids and helmets. This will take place for all competitors during the Control opening times.

Safety Cover

It is expected that safety kayaks will be in place below the main Grandtully rapid on both days and bank throw lines will be in place. No other safety cover will be in place for the length of the Classic courses so all participants should ensure that they take responsibility for their own wellbeing and their skill level is appropriate for the courses paddled.

IMPORTANT ACCESS & RIVER INFORMATION

- You should park cars in the SCA Station Yard. The Inn on the Tay car park is for patrons only.
- Launch at Aberfeldy Bridge (Map 52, Grid Ref 852492) or Cemetery (opposite Distillery). Pre-start takes 25 mins (from bridge) or 20 mins (from Cemetery) to paddle to Start.
